The Kalinga Fellowship is a programme that brings together progressive leaders from business, government and civil society to facilitate breakthroughs in thinking and action in combatting human trafficking.

2020-2021 FOCUS

How can the leaders of government, business and civil society come together to combat human trafficking?

This is a virtual programme involving 14 three hour breakthrough sessions over five months.

The Programme Teams

There are five teams dedicated to implementing the breakthrough solutions. These solutions have been proven to move the needle on combatting human trafficking. Now is better then new.

- 1. The Power of Technology and Data to create the first truly multi-sector information sharing platform. Strategic partners: IBM & Traffik Analysis Hub.
- 2. The Financial Coalition to bring leaders of banks and the financial industry together to disrupt the economies of trafficking. Strategic partners: The International Centre for Missing & Exploited Children & Halotrade.
- 3. Zero Tolerance to Child Marriage to enrol millions of young people in creating a zero tolerance to child marriage. Strategic partners: Mission Better Tomorrow & the Government of Telangana.
- Next Generation Policing to implement the very best global practices of policing across the whole police force. Strategic partners: Kerala and Telangana Police, Mission Better Tomorrow and the Student Police Cadets.
- 5. The First Responder to roll out an awareness to last-mile families and communities across India of the true nature of human trafficking. Strategic partner: FXB India Suraksha.

The Five-Month Programme

Each team will embark on a five-month programme, implementing breakthrough solutions into the world, starting on 1st December 2020. The focus of each team will be on action and impact.

The programme teaches and utilises progressive leadership and strategy tools. It is facilitated by experts from BRIDGE and the Bridge Institute.

Each delegate will be supported and trained to transform their personal agency, mindsets, behaviours and capabilities to develop their societal leadership.

IBM has completed a significant landscape study of trafficking in India. This will support all the streams.
